Homeless Situation

- Place not meant for habitation (e.g., a vehicle, an abandoned building, bus/train/subway station/airport or anywhere outside)
- Emergency shelter, including hotel or motel paid for with emergency shelter voucher, Host Home shelter
- Safe Haven

Institutional Situation

- Foster Care Home or Foster Care Group Home
- Hospital or other residential non-psychiatric medical facility
- Jail, Prison, Juvenile Detention Facility
- Long-term care facility or nursing home
- Psychiatric Hospital or Other Psychiatric Facility
- Substance Abuse Treatment or Detox Center

Temporary Housing Situations

- Transitional Housing for homeless persons (including homeless youth)
- Residential project or halfway house with no homeless criteria
- Hotel or Motel paid for without emergency shelter voucher
- Host Home (non-crisis)
- Staying or living with family, temporary tenure (e.g., room, apartment or house)
- Staying or living with friends, temporary tenure (e.g., room, apartment or house)
- Moved from one HOPWA funded project to HOPWA TH

Permanent Housing Situation

- Staying or living with family, permanent tenure
- Staying or living with friends, permanent tenure
- Moved from one HOPWA funded project to HOPWA PH
- Rental by client, no ongoing housing subsidy
- Rental by client, with ongoing housing subsidy
- Owned by client, with ongoing housing subsidy
- Owned by client, no ongoing housing subsidy

Other

- No exit interview completed
- Other
- Deceased
- Client doesn't know
- Client prefers not to answer

Tips and Tricks



75% of Rapid Rehousing Exits fall under these 4 categories (sampled from a generic RRH program)

1. Rental by client, with no ongoing housing subsidy +45%
2. Staying or living with family, permanent tenure +15%
3. Place not meant for habitation +9%
4. No exit interview completed +7%
