

Example 1: *Client is staying in a mobile home permanently with family*


1. Start at the top with the first grouped and individual criteria and follow flow down until absolute option

2. In this example, a client staying in a mobile home does not meet any one of the grouped criteria nor other criteria for literally homeless, so we'll follow the "**if false, then**" which leads us to the "Imminent Risk of Homelessness"

3. In this example, housing is permanent and thus housing loss is not expected within 14 days. Therefore the client is not homeless and would follow the next, **if false, then**. Which leads to the absolute resulting category of "**Not Homeless**"

Example 2: *Client has been living in an RV in public parking without water or electricity for 6 months. The client has never previously been homeless*

1. Start at the top with the first grouped and individual criteria and follow flow down until absolute option

2. In this example, a client staying in a RV in public parking (public parking does not provide running water and electricity). Therefore the client meets the criteria for "Literally Homeless". Next we will follow the "**If true, and**" to the "Chronically Homeless" criteria.

3. The client has been literally homeless for 6 months which doesn't meet the criteria of 12 consecutive months. Also, this is the client's first time being homeless. Therefore, this client doesn't meet the criteria for "Chronically Homeless". This leads to reverting to the absolute resulting category of "**Literally Homeless**".
